Special Taxing Districts in Your Community

A special taxing district is established to provide a service to all of the residents within that district which the residents pay for through their annual tax bill. The annual cost for the service is prorated evenly to all of the residents in the district. The services provided are negotiated and supervised by the special taxing district's office within the Miami-Dade County government.

Committees within each special taxing district have formed or are in the process of forming to review and evaluate the current guard service as well as the security needs of the specific neighborhood. The purpose of the committee is to provide feedback about the level of service (in the opinion of the residents) which will in turn allow the quard company to continually improve their service.

50 States Security company provides the guard service for Coventry, Highland Gardens, Highland Lakes, and Oak Forest. U.S. Security Associates, Inc. provides the guard services for Enchanted Lakes.

Currently, there are two roving guard special taxing districts in the community. Oak Forest and the surrounding streets have a Florida State Trooper roving their community and Highland Ranch Estates has roving security provided by 50 States Security.

Crime Watch

The Crime Watch program has been supported by the county for many years and provides the opportunity to get to know your neighbors while protecting our homes. A crime watch area is made up of one to two blocks of homes that are located adjacent to each other. A designated leader gathers data from the homes within the area and works with personnel from Miami-Dade County in the Crime Watch Department to complete the process of setting-up the territory.

The current economic situation makes it even more important to consider this especially in the areas where there are empty houses. Several blocks have recently created new crime watch areas. The proposed cuts in the county's budget may impact this program. Start yours today! Please contact

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Education/Schools

As we have read over the last six months, the Miami-Dade County Public School system is working very hard to deliver a first-class education to the students even with the current budget constraints.

The Board is working on the traffic and parking concerns at VAB Highland Oaks Elementary school and Aventura Waterways K-8. It is a very slow process, but please keep looking for small changes and eventually the overall changes will be obvious.



One of the largest challenges we as a neighborhood face at this time is the lack of funding by the school district for the athletic and afterschool activities at Highland Oaks Middle School. Because of the prime location of this school, they are exploring the use of advertising along the fence that runs on Ives Dairy Road to fund these programs.





As a residential neighborhood many of the residents have expressed their deep concerns about how the signs look on a fence and their desire not to have this occur. While we are all aware of the budget constraints and the need to raise the funds it would be great if as a neighborhood we could come up with alternatives to raise the necessary funds without putting up signs on the fence.
